Hello Witty Women and welcome to 2014!

Hopefully you have had a great break, survived Christmas, saw the kids back to school and are now ready to think about what you would like to achieve this year.

At the end of 2013, I mentioned that as a result of our recent member survey WiT had been reviewing a number of important items such as membership, programs and even the structure and process of the Awards. We continue to be committed to supporting, promoting and recognising women working in technologies fields and constantly evolving to suit their needs.

Following our January WiT Board meeting, I am delighted to report a number of changes to support members:

MEMBERSHIP FEES - Annual individual membership fees have been reduced (yes reduced) to \$99 per year. **Effective from 1 March 2014**. We have recognised that budgets are tight and we want to make membership as affordable and accessible as possible.

STUDENT MEMBERS - A couple of years ago the WiT Board made the decision to offer free <u>2 year</u> <u>membership</u> to women studying technology as a way of encouraging them to build invaluable networks

early. This has been extremely popular and we are thrilled to advise that we are extending the free student membership to include the first year of employment (on a calendar basis).

MENTORING - Last year we surveyed the users of our Mentoring program to work out how WiT can improve the experience for both Mentors and Mentees. Thank you for your feedback. We've listened and are putting together an improved program - catering for everyone's mentoring preferences and time restraints and more effective at both bringing mentors and mentees together and creating best-practice mentoring relationships. We will announce these in the March newsletter. However, it was identified that there were some very accomplished mentors that have not participated in the program given their workload and at the same time there were a large number of members who would love to have a single session with suitable mentor to be able get advice and guidance with a specific issue, without the commitment to a long term

mentoring relationship. So we are introducing...... **MENTOR FOR A MOMENT!** (details coming soon!)

As well as the above we again have some great events coming your way and some great initiatives and alliances we are working on to benefit our members.

Look out for further announcements for the Awards Program and if you are interested in our WiT Board Readiness Program now is the time to express your interest. Due to overwhelming demand we are scheduling a Board Readiness Program for late 2014. **Express your interest now before you miss out!** There are limited spaces available.

We are also looking forward to our upcoming February Board meeting with the Hon Ian Walker MP, Minister for Science, Information Technology, Innovation and the Arts in attendance. We will be engaging him on the needs of women in the technology industries and calling for his commitment to support us and them.

WHAT'S GOOD FOR WOMEN IS GOOD FOR BUSINESS



Recently the Shriver Report launched a groundbreaking report, "A

<u>Woman's Nation Pushes Back from the Brink</u>" which describes the tremendous challenges women face in the US workforce. It makes the case that despite promotion of high-profile women CEOs, there is still a significant wage and career gap for working women, leading to poverty, family crisis and education problems with our children.

In particular, Maria Shriver's personal essay, <u>"Powerful and Powerless"</u>, (video here) makes a very compelling case. You may be surprised to learn, that 70% of low wage workers do not get sick leave and women make up two-thirds of this population. 63% of women are now breadwinners and more than 40% are sole breadwinners. These are often the women who serve us in restaurants, teach our children, work behind the counter, or work next to us in the office.

Much of the solution to this problem lies in the hands of employers.

Member Judith Clements

Distinguished Professor Judith Clements and her team have identified enzymes that make ovarian cancer resistant to chemotherapy.



QUT scientists are making significant inroads into our understanding of the deadliest form of ovarian cancer after identifying two enzymes that make it resistant to chemotherapy.

Distinguished Professor Judith Clements said serous ovarian cancer spreads rapidly throughout the abdominal area and ultimately becomes resistant to chemotherapy treatment.

"This form of cancer is incredibly aggressive, moving quickly from the ovaries to the abdominal cavity where the tumour cells aggregate or clump, become embedded in the wall of the abdomen and then grow at quite a rapid pace," she said.

"While chemotherapy will often work initially, this form of cancer has found a way of beating the current chemotherapy drugs and quite quickly becomes immune to treatment.

"So our research is tackling the cancer on two fronts to better understand how cancer cells aggregate and survive in the ascites fluid that accumulates in the abdomen and why it is resistant to chemotherapy.

"Funding from Cancer Council Queensland is assisting with this research."

What is your background and your work and your career to date?

I started my IT career later than most. As a working mother I completed my IT degree & went from IT Project Management to managing a specialist IT & analyst business unit for a large professional services firm. I successfully bought out that part of the business and have been Managing Director of my own Information Analytics firm for nearly 2 years.

2. Describe how you felt when you were nominated for the award and when you won?

I felt honoured and humbled to be nominated for the award but immensely proud of my achievements. When I won I was very proud, not only because of where I have reached in my career but because I have always had such a great team and family that supported me and my ideas along the way.

3. Can you briefly describe why you were chosen for this award?

I think (measured) risk taking, innovation, responsiveness and a client focus have been a key part of why I have been successful and considered entrepreneurial. Going out on my own with InfoView was a calculated risk that paid off.

4. What do you feel are the qualities women need to succeed in the technology sectors?

Tenacity, courage, curiosity, good people skills, willingness to go above and beyond – and confidence in your own ideas , skills and knowledge. I knew where I wanted to be – and then simply worked back from that to work out my strategy.

5. Who are your role models and how have they contributed to your success?

My father always believed any of his children could do anything and there were 6 girls in my family so we never felt gender was a contributing factor to success. I am also a great admirer of Therese Rein and how she made her way confidently in her industry without losing her femininity.

6. What are the benefits of having an association such as WiT to support, acknowledge and recognize the outstanding?

WiT provides so many opportunities for networking that it would be impossible to miss meeting someone amazing at any one of them. I am constantly in admiration of the event presenters and other award winners and always go away from an event inspired.

7. If you had a magic wand to change one thing to make the world work better what would you do?

Tolerance and respect of all others and their needs and their differences – A more considered world might put others before their own needs and perhaps an improved culture of really caring for those we work with, mix with and love might impact so many other aspects of our lives like the measures of wealth & success, childcare, health, life balance and ultimately happiness.

SPONSOR PROFILE - IBM EXITE CAMPS FOR GIRLS



The fast-paced global economy requires a diverse and versatile talent pool to keep up with the demands of constant change and to maintain competitiveness. The most successful companies in the world show that

diversity in the workforce – and that includes gender diversity - is a defining tool for success.

EXITE (Exploring Interests in Technology & Engineering) Camps are one of IBM's diversity initiatives to help fuel young girls' interests in taking science and math classes throughout high school. The Camps are also designed to help girls understand how rewarding engineering and technology careers can be and how they offer opportunities to be creative, to become a leader and to give back to the community.

IBM Australia began holding EXITE Camps in 2001. The target audience for the Camps is high school girls aged 13 to 16. The Camps are now held annually in collaboration with State-based Departments of Education to encourage young women to pursue studies in engineering, IT and science. Camps have been held in Sydney, Melbourne, Brisbane and the Gold Coast and Ballarat has hosted a Camp for Indigenous girls and boys.

The Camps are run by IBM volunteers who work together to deliver a wide range of activities for the students over a 3 to 4 day period. The activities can include; web-page design, computer chip design, laser optics, animation, robotics, and working with computer hardware and software. The Camps also have a mentoring component which matches the students with female IBM volunteers who serve as e-Mentors throughout the school year as part of IBM MentorPlace program.
