We held our Annual General Meeting on Thursday 4th April to great success. We thank all our members for coming, for your ongoing support and for making 2018 the success it was. Key announcements from the AGM:

- We welcomed our new Co-President, Life Sciences Dr Claudia Giurgiuman and are excited to have such an established contributor to the Life Sciences network. Claudia has more than 16 years' experience in medical research, research management and grants scheme development and management and holds a PhD in the field of Medicine, a Bachelor of Science degree with First Class Honours and a Postgraduate Certificate in Project Management.
- We will be focusing over the year on a new strategic plan prioritising: 1)
 Launching our new advocacy program; 2) Extending our reach; 3)
 Maintaining a strong grass-roots community and; 4) Planning for sustainability and growth.
- We announced our survey results WiT surveys are an important finger on the pulse of Queensland women in technology and this year we had almost 400 participants. See below for some key findings.

Our first mentoring program for 2019 commences this week. The program is fully booked with outstanding mentor response. If you have missed out send your EOI for our next session in July to secretariat@wit.org.au. We have supported more than 200 mentors and mentees in the last 3 years!

We kicked off our Board Readiness program with 20 participants. The program runs from March through to July with 9 workshops, culminating with an industry luncheon to celebrate our graduates and introduce them to industry. The Board Readiness program is highly regarded and is a customised leadership course for women wanting to step up to Directorship. The program is supported by the AICD. The program has been running for more than 10 years and to date, almost 100 participants have successfully graduated and well over 50% of graduates have gone on to gain Board roles, including more than 10 women than have come onto the WiT Board and 4 who have gone on to become President of WiT. WiT Survey key takeouts

Who are you?

You are mostly hard-working career women from all branches of science and technology in the throes of your career

Why do you come to WiT? 29% for awards and recognition; 25% for Business opportunities; 13% to give back; and 11% for job opportunities

What else would you like WiT to do? 51% want more online events/resources; 54% more professional education; 36% - more job related services / career advice

and 32% more networking

What role does our community play – how do you describe WiT? 67% describe us as an industry association; 19% a social networking group ... yet many of you already consider WiT to an advocate for issues that affect you – with 60% agree/strongly agree; 33% neutral; 7% disagree/strongly disagree.

WiT has a strong influence on women's rights – 42% agree/strongly agree; 49% neutral; 9% disagree/strongly disagree

How many of you have experienced gender bias at work?

- 58% have faced discrimination
- Only 13% experience bias
- 50% see equality as an organisational priority
- Only 18% are comfortable negotiating pay
- Only 16% observe gender bias

What are the biggest barriers facing women in our industry? Unequal promotional opportunities; gender bias; lack of female role models; lack of mentors; reluctance to take risks; poor negotiation skills; different pay for same skills & inflexible hours and conditions.

Are we making headway with the issues? Only 49% agree that women have it better now than 5 years ago; only 32% believe business is doing enough and only 19% this Government is doing enough. A huge thank you to our corporate supporters and government employers for leading the way.

And would you have it any other way? WiT exists to help all of our members to balance the huge challenges and opportunities that come with being a woman in technology and we are glad you agree with 55% agreeing that WiT can help your career and the future looks bright with 83% of your agreeing you would recommend a career in technology.

WiT is determined to be nimble, relevant, responsive and above all helpful to you ... and as you can see, these are the key issues that underpin our huge program of educational activities and events. Unlike other organisations, we are diverse, inclusive and agnostic when it comes to professional disciplines. That is what makes WiT different...

- Nominations open Tuesday 7th May and close 31st May that's ONE MONTH to nominate your female mentors, colleagues, sisters, friends, or role-models.
- You do not need to be nominated to apply. You can apply without being nominated - However, if you nominate someone, or are nominated by someone, they do/you do, need to go on to apply.
- Applications open Tuesday 7th May and close Sunday 30th June There is time to apply but if you want to submit the best application, then
 allow yourself time.
- For tips and tricks on how to apply and what to prepare for, you can contact
 us and we will send you a helpful manual; and of course are willing to
 answer any questions.
- After the application deadline, an expert panel reviews all applications and through a voting process, a few are shortlisted for an interview which is held on Saturday 3rd August. A separate expert panel then conducts the interviews, after which, the finalists are announced Monday 12th August and winners revealed at the Gala Awards ceremony on Friday 30th August.
